Summary of Offenses and Probable Cause Affidavit

On 3/12/2019 at approximately 1759 hours, I responded to Kings Hwy and Angle Rd in reference to vehicle crash. Dispatch advised a small vehicle had struck a semi at the intersection. Deputy J. Selph #253 also responded to the scene and began to conduct his crash investigation.

Upon arrival, I positioned my car behind Deputy B. Loupe's vehicle which was positioned behind the at fault vehicle. Deputy Selph told me St. Lucie County Fire Rescue medics had told him they observed the at fault driver to have constricted pupils and believed he may be intoxicated. The medics advised he refused medical treatment on scene and refused to go to the hospital. Deputy Selph asked that I speak with him at that time as he also observed his pupils were constricted and his eyes were bloodshot. Deputy Loupe and Deputy Selph explained that the at fault driver was westbound on Angle Rd making a turn onto Kings Hwy to travel southbound and had lost control. His vehicle spun in a counter clockwise manner causing the front end to strike a semi that was stationary facing northbound on Kings Hwy.

I made contact with the at fault driver, identified by his Florida driver's license as Andrew Hartman. He was leaning against the guard rail near his vehicle. I observed the vehicle to have moderate front end damage and to be disabled. I observed Hartman as he spoke to Deputy Loupe while I waited for the crash investigation to be completed. I observed Hartman's pupils to be constricted and his eyes were very bloodshot. He was talkative, but his speech was very low. He was also perspiring a noticeable amount. I noticed he had some minor lacerations to his forehead and was holding yellow shop rag wiping blood from his face. He was slow and deliberate in his movements as well.

When Deputy Selph advised he had concluded his crash investigation, he spoke to Hartman and advised him he was finished and turned his documents over to him aside from his driver's license which he provided to me. I began to speak with Hartman

and advised him of my observations. I told him I would like to make sure he was ok to drive. I read him his Miranda Rights via my agency issued card and he said he understood and was willing to speak to me. I asked him if he would agree to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Exercises and he said yes. I asked him if he took any medications or used any drugs of any kind. He said no aside from over the counter aspirin.

The Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Exercise: I first checked for equal tracking in both eyes, equal pupil size, and resting nystagmus. I noticed he had a lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, but no other nystagmus. Both eyes lacked convergence. I noticed Hartman had very distinct and strong eyelid tremors which is indicative of marijuana impairment. He swayed slightly in a circular motion during the exercise. Hartman showed me a spot on his leg where he said he had been hit with something at work yesterday. Before administering the other exercises I asked him if he had any other injuries and if his leg would affect his balance. He said it no. I asked him how his head was feeling or if he was dizzy or had any issues that would affect his balance and he said no and that he was fine.

The Walk and Turn Exercise: I explained and demonstrated the exercise to him and he said he understood and had no questions. Hartman lost his balance during the initial instruction phase and stepped out of the instructed position. He raised his arms for balance after he turned and paused to regain his balance. He was very slow and deliberate in his movements. He performed to rest of the exercise correctly.

The One Leg Stand Exercise: I explained and demonstrated the exercise to him and he said he understood and had no questions. He failed to look down at his raised foot until I reminded him. He only raised his foot approximately 1-2" off of the ground instead of the instructed 6". He dropped his foot on the count of four and he raised his arms for balance. He swayed noticeably throughout the exercise.

The Finger to Nose Exercise: I explained and demonstrated the exercise to him and he said he understood and had no questions. He missed the tip of his nose three times and used the pad of his finger instead of the tip. I again noticed distinct and strong eyelid tremors. He swayed noticeably throughout the exercise.

Hartman displayed behavior indicating his normal faculties were impaired by performing unsatisfactory on the divided attention tasks. I felt he was impaired and unable to operate a vehicle safely. I placed the Hartman under arrest for DUI and advised him of same. Deputy Lopez asked Hartman if there was anything illegal in the vehicle and Hartman said no and that he could check.

I placed Hartman in the rear of my patrol vehicle at that time. Deputy Lopez advised he located a red bag in the back seat of Hartman's vehicle containing fake urine. He also advised the bag smelled of marijuana and there was a two pack of tobacco blunts with one missing that smelled strongly of marijuana. Deputy Selph asked Hartman's wife, Allison Hartman, if Hartman was required to take a drug test at work and she said yes. He showed her the contents of the red bag and asked her if she knew anything about the fake urine or what was in the bag and she denied any knowledge of it.

I returned to my car where Hartman was and asked Hartman why he would have fake urine in his work bag and he told me him and his wife like to "role play" and it was a "novelty item". I collected the fake urine as evidence at that time.

I transported Hartman to Lawnwood Regional Medical Center for medical clearance at that time. Mrs. Hartman requested to follow to find out if he had any injuries. I told her she could. Once at the hospital I began to walk Hartman inside and his wife walked up from behind and stated "Andrew, no blood or urine, only breath" seeming to be instructing him no to provide blood or urine samples. He repeated what she said and nodded to her. I was then placed in a room with Hartman for him to be treated. I advised Hartman I had not observed any indication that he was under the influence of alcohol and I believed he was under the influence of a chemical or controlled substance. I then asked him if he would consent to a blood draw. He said he no and he would only consent to a breath test. I told him I had no reason to request a breath test and explained why. He again refused to provide a blood sample. I then asked him if he would provide a urine sample and he again said no. He stated to me "things stay in your system for a long time". I explained that blood would show what levels of what substances were there now at this time. I again asked if he was refusing blood and urine tests and he said yes. I read him Implied Consent via my agency issued card and he said he understood. He still refused to submit to any test beside a breath test.

I received medical clearance from the hospital and was advised he had no medical issues or head injuries and only sustained superficial injuries. I transported Hartman to the St. Lucie County Jail without incident where he was turned over to jail staff. He was issued citation #A16AM2E for DUI with property damage. This case is cleared by arrest.
